Dr. Ervin Staub - Professor Emeritus and Founding Director, Psychology of Peace and Violence Program, University of Massachusetts at Amherst

Dr. Staub will address new understandings of the role of bystanders both in times of genocide and day-to-day life. He will consider reasons for passivity, and the harm done by passivity in less

extreme, more everyday situations. He has conducted many projects in field settings, ranging from working with teachers and parents to promote altruism in children, to trainings and educational radio projects in Rwanda, Burundi and the Congo to promote psychological recovery and reconciliation.
